



UniUbi Hug: A Universal Hug for the memory and intellectual legacy of Ubiratan D'Ambrosio RECORDING GUIDELINES

Record a video of a **maximum of 15 seconds**, which **values your local culture, the way and language of your people, according to the bases of D'Ambrosio's Ethnomathematics**.

In the video, within **15 seconds**, the content of your speech must be:
I, [SAY YOUR NAME], from [INSTITUTION/COMMUNITY IF YOU WANT], from [LOCAL town, COUNTRY], support the International Day of Ethnomathematics on December 8th.

The best way to record your video is by using your cell phone: the front camera (used for selfies) and in the horizontal position, as shown in the picture. Although, in general, the front cameras are of lower quality, they allow you to see yourself during the recording of the testimony and better adjust to the frame.



When recording, be careful that your hand does not cover the microphone of the device when using the cell phone to talk. A good strategy for recording your testimony is to lean your cell phone on a pile of books or use a tripod.

Important Tips!

- record your video, at most, 01 meter from the cell phone,
- record your video in a small, closed and quiet place,
- when recording your video, turn off the fan/air conditioner,
- do not talk too loud or too softly,
- have good lighting: the light should be just above you (natural lighting - ceiling lamps) or in front of you (a window). Don't have any light source behind you, solar or artificial.
- And do not forget to test it before you send it!
